

Long-Range Rules and Guidelines for Match Directors and Instructors

Downrange:

1. All work performed downrange, be it work party or otherwise, must be done during a formally scheduled range closure or range rental/closure.
2. No downrange work or activities are to occur without proper signage indicating that the range is closed. Signs are to be secured at the gate to the Long Range, as well as the 100 yard "Jungle Walk" near the Action Bays.
3. **Permanent targets and designators are to remain in place. No moving or re-positioning.**
4. **Targets can be swapped out for an event. However, the original "permanent" target(s) must be reinstalled immediately following any event.**
5. Additional targets and designators will be available on-site for events. However, any added Targets, Designators, and T-Posts must be removed and properly stored in the designated storage area (near the Right-Hand Limit) after any event.
6. **All efforts must be made to maintain, repair, and paint targets after an event. THIS INCLUDES REMOVING AND PROPERLY DISPOSING OF ALL BROKEN T-POSTS.**
7. If a target is damaged, please inform the Long-Range Chairman so the target can be replaced.
8. If a target is replaced because of damage, please inform the Long-Range Chairman so maps and target lists can be updated.
9. A maximum of 7 T-Posts (aggregate) can be left "driven" downrange for future events, so long as it is to be a reoccurring target position. Driven T-Posts without targets must be painted Safety Yellow.

Up-Range:

1. During events where more than one FFP is being used (aka- Areas 1, 2, 3, etc.), communications must be established and remain consistent with designated Range Officers at each position via the use of portable radios.
2. Additional props may be added for events. However, upon the completion of any event, props must be removed and/or properly stored in designated areas.
3. All firing positions must be cleaned after an event. This includes but is not limited to brass and trash.

Cease Fires:

1. During any event, no person(s) is to go downrange without a clear and verified "Cease fire/ Cold Range."
2. Cease Fires are to be monitored up range by designated Range Officers, who will be sure all parties are adhering to all rules of firearms safety.
3. Range Officers must be designated at every FFP during a Cease Fire.
4. During a Cease Fire, there is no weapon handling or manipulation of any kind. Period!
5. Following a Cease Fire, the range must be declared "Hot" by the Match Director and/or Instructor. Then verified by all appointed Range Officers prior to commencing fire.
